WHY TRASH MATTERS



This female mallard duck was found with the ring from a milk jug stuck around her neck and mouth. Fortunately she was brought to the Wildlife Rescue Center where the ring was able to be removed and she was able to be rehabilitated and released. Always remember to cut those milk jug and six-pack rings.



This adult Canada goose was brought to the Center with fishing line wrapped around its legs. The line was able to be removed and the resulting wounds were able to heal. This guy made a great recovery and was able to be released! Always remember to properly dispose of your fishing line and hooks.



Being a curious animal can be an asset for a raccoon. However, if they are able to get into dumpsters or trash cans this curiosity could be problematic! This raccoon got its head stuck in an aluminum can trying to find a snack. Keep your dumpsters and trash cans tightly closed to deter any unwelcome guests and prevent harm to our wild neighbors!
